Klinik

This new efficient way of contacting the Practice if you have online access, seems to be going well. The telephone lines are of course still available, but as many people are using Klinik, the number of abandoned calls has reduced and waiting times are becoming shorter. Once more Practice staff are recruited and trained, it's hoped that this improvement will continue. However Klinik is the best way to contact the Practice and the vast majority of people receive a response and if appropriate, an appointment the same day.

Covid/Flu clinics

The Practice has administered over 17,500 vaccinations over the past few weeks. This includes about 170 housebound patients and people at home will continue to be vaccinated as quickly as possible, but this takes time, given the rurality of the area.

For patients who have yet to be vaccinated, please ring 119, or go through the NHS national booking website where you can also find local pharmacies who can provide Covid or flu vaccinations.

Dementia

Online Access to Patient Records

If you have a computer, you don't need to ring the surgery if you use SystemOnline, though the Practice website, to check recent test results, order your repeat medication and view your patient record. We are told after a blood test that we will only be contacted if there is anything to discuss about the test results. However, some of us would still like to

know that everything is as it should be.

If you've heard nothing after a week and you have online access, you can check for yourself and see 'Normal' or 'Satisfactory' and 'No further action'. This puts your mind at rest and saves an unnecessary phone call.

By far the easiest way to re-order your medication, is through SystemOnline, or the NHS App by simply ticking the boxes of the items you need and a few days later they will be ready in your nominated pharmacy. If you are on a repeat batch, you don't need to contact the surgery, just collect your medication as usual from the pharmacy.

Your records contain details of appointments, prescriptions requests, test results, hospital and other relevant letters and information - all in the one place. Being able to see these records can help you to better understand any issues you might have and help you manage your condition. You can also cancel an appointment through the app - which is really important, so that the slot can be offered to another patient.

SystemOnline is easy to set up, go to Klinik - "General enquiries/update your details" and then ask in there to be registered for online access. You will be contacted with easy to follow instructions how to set it up on your computer and/or phone.

So you can use SystemOnline and the NHS app for many things, but Klinik is still the route for GP and clinical appointments and medical issues, as well as queries relating to medications.

MARNHULL GREEN TEAMS



Marnhull Green Teams' two 'electric' events in early November were well-received.

The first was 'Going Solar', an evening at the Village Hall which enabled people to meet and chat with PV (solar) panel and battery installers DES Renewable Energy (see desrenewables.com) and Dorset Energy Solutions (dorsetenergysolutions.co.uk). Several individual contacts were made, and a group of people interested in making a joint approach to installers was established. The potential benefits of this idea are that it benefits busy installers to have several projects ongoing at the same time in the same area - and therefore your installation might happen more quickly - and that there may be some economies of scale to be had - and who doesn't like a bargain?

This interest group will be independent of Marnhull Green Teams: any contracts agreed will be direct between clients and the installation company they choose. If panels and batteries are not appropriate for you, other options are available. As we noted in last month's Messenger, Ridgewater Energy have been appointed by Dorset Council, BCP Council and Public Health Dorset to provide free, impartial energy advice, including on funding support schemes. Depending on your circumstances they may be able to install free cavity wall insulation and/or free loft insulation, and can provide new heating systems or replacement boilers. The second of Marnhull Green Teams' electric events was an electric vehicle show, which was also popular. Here, owners of electric cars, bikes and a van shared their experience of these vehicles with people interested in driving or riding electric in future. We hope to hold another show in the Spring. Watch for details!

Marnhull Green Teams will be running other projects too in the New Year. For example - and as you may have seen on BBC Points West - we are helping Dorset CAN (Climate Action Network) with their Great Big Dorset Hedge campaign, which aims to create a county-wide network of wildlife corridors. Dorset CAN are looking for hedge surveyors (training will be given), local coordinators and planting teams, and/or you can set up or contribute to a local tree nursery, collecting and planting seeds, or relocating seedlings from your garden. 

CALLING ALL VILLAGERS - AN OPPORTUNITY TO FUND YOUR PROJECT!

Did you know that, as a result of the recent approval of the developments in Crown Road, Burton Street and Butts Close, funding can be made available to support projects in the village? No? then read on... For large developments, the owner/developer has to have what is called a 'Section 106 agreement' (no idea why its called that...) that sets out monies that can be distributed to projects that help offset the impact of the developments.

We have 106 agreements for the Crown Road and Burton Street developments and the agreements set out potential funding for things like **footpaths, village hall enhancements, play area refurbishment and development, libraries and others.**

I have deliberately used the words 'may', 'potential' and 'opportunity'. **This funding is on a use it or lose it basis and we will lose this money if we don't have a set of well thought out, ready-to-go projects when the funds become available. This is where you come in.**

If you have ideas for projects for the village, please make contact with a Parish Councillor or with me at mark.turner@marnhull-pc.org.uk and we will collate the list for review. As a guide the projects should be a 'one off' investment (e.g. solar panels for the village hall) rather than of an ongoing basis (e.g. extra doctors in the surgery) and should try to address impacts from the development (e.g. extra folk in the village, additional stress on existing infrastructure etc). If in doubt, please send it in anyway as it will be useful to have everyone's ideas.

A S106 Working Group (snappy title) has been set up to help co-ordinate this effort. More about this in the next issue of the Messenger and on Village Facebook updates. **If you have experience of 106 agreements, planning processes or contracts in general and would like to help, please also contact us at the above email address.**

Remember, this opportunity won't last forever, so lets get our ideas together!

CHRISTMAS LIGHTS

Altogether it was a most interesting evening, though I confess to Nick that I am still not won over to the sound of the tin whistle.



Where to get trusted advice on consumer problems?

With budgets stretched we want to make sure we are buying wisely and know what to do to get our money back, or problems sorted, if a purchase goes wrong. This is especially true as we approach Christmas, a time when we all probably spend a bit more.

If you've read our trading standards' editorial before, then you'll know what we often mention the Citizens Advice consumer service, their website and helpline. They are the one stop shop for independent and trusted consumer advice, assistance and to report something to trading standards.

Topics covered include energy, holidays, buying or repairing a car, scams, insurance, water, phone internet and TV, home improvements, issues with your post as well as when something goes wrong with a purchase, or if you change your mind.

Many people access this trusted advice through the consumer section of the Citizens Advice website at <https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/consumer>. There you'll find pre-shopping advice and what to do when things go wrong, including template letters to help you to sort out simple consumer problems for yourself.

When you need more tailored advice, usually because you have a more complex problem and the general guidance on the website is not specific enough, then you can chat with a web advisor using the Citizens Advice online web chat facility.

When you haven't access to the internet, or if you would just prefer to speak with an advisor, then you can call the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 223 1133. This is also the number to use to report something to trading standards.

If you would just prefer to speak with someone in person, then this is supported through the network of local Citizens Advice offices found in Dorset's larger towns.

As you can see there are many ways to receive independent and trusted consumer advice from Citizens Advice. Hopefully nothing will go wrong with your purchases this Christmas, but if it does then Citizens Advice is here to help.

BISHOP'S LETTER



Your Kingdom come...

The season of Advent begins on Sunday the 27 November. Like Lent, it is a penitential season when the liturgical colour is purple and a time of preparation to celebrate the feast of the Incarnation without which there would be no feast of the Resurrection. Advent is not as long as Lent and it seems to be more about feasting than fasting! In a way it's 'Lent's-lite' but for many of us one of our favourite seasons of the year as we watch and wait in anticipation of the joy and excitement of the celebration of the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem and also contemplate the realisation of God's eternal Kingdom at the end of time.

It is becoming something of a cliché to list the crises that presently beset us: climate, war, recession, refugees etc in a world already feeling unsettling different post-Covid. At times we can begin to feel overwhelmed and turn in on ourselves rather than remaining outward facing as is the Christian's orientation. God in Christ became a human being not to be served but to serve. Christ the King is with us still - here and now. His kingship is not based on human power but on serving and loving others. We are called to exhibit those Kingdom values in their lives until at last our prayer will be answered and God's Kingdom will 'come on earth as it is in heaven.'

As part of our on-going discernment of a new vision and strategy for the diocese, the Dean, the Very Revd Nicholas Papadopoulos, has kindly written some prayers for us all to use a Diocese this Advent in our personal prayer time and when we meet together in church or on other occasions [see www.salisbury.anglican.org/Advent]. They are beautiful and I commend them to you most warmly. They recognise the situation in which we find ourselves but remind us that we are never alone and that our calling is to join in where God is already at work in his world.

May the God of peace make you completely holy, ready for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Surely it is the role of the Parish Council to proactively set out plans on expenditure and challenge decisions made on the S106 monies. The council's recommendations should then be presented to the village for consultation. The village cannot be expected to be aware of all the projects which may require financial support and is dependent on the Parish Council to disseminate this information.

Plus, if a submitted question is said to be on the agenda, please make sure it is.

Most people in Marnhull only want the best for the village and expect our council representatives to work together to achieve this. The "them and us" attitude which was evident from some of the councillors at the most recent meeting is not conducive to achieving a satisfactory working relationship.

TRAFFIC SPEED 20'S PLENTY - THE NEW NORM

A novel but apt way to mark Entry to my Eighth decade (I intend to acclimatise gradually to 70), was attendance at the national 20sPlenty conference held in Oxfordshire County Hall, as coordinator for 20sPlenty for Dorset campaign. I invited all 82 Dorset Councillors to celebrate with me in Oxford and even to cover the £100. Public Delegate fee for one lucky Member but alas, I was the sole Dorsetonian (a name reserved for residents, not just indigenous folk). Our last conference in 2019 was held in London's Borough of Walthamstow to which I had travelled by train bus and bike with ease, given that Borough's 20mph roads.

the day before conference, we viewed Oxford's sights from atop a double-decker with its history and fascinating facts relayed to us via red earphones to match our bus. Choral Evensong at Queens and Merton Colleges (not the same night) were an unexpected delight to our senses as was The Botanic Garden in rain: it was the site of an early Jewish cemetery before Edward 1 expelled them from his shores in 13thC.

On 20th Oct, County Hall welcomed people from across the country to learn how highway authorities, both urban and rural, are reducing traffic speeds, and with it road injuries and deaths, in built up areas from the 30mph limit, introduced before WW2 when motor vehicles were a rarity, to the NEW NORM of 20mph. Over 26million people in the UK (over 1 in 3) now live in an authority where fear of traffic speed is recognised as a major factor in car dependency = deterrent to active modes of travel such as walking or cycling = obesity through lack of physical activity = poor mental health and social isolation and have done something about it by changing their default limit from 30 to 20mph. Consider too deaths and disease caused by Particle Pollution from heavy vehicle emissions (the modern car) which will not be addressed by switching to electric powered since tyre particle pollution increases with increased weight of e-vehicles. If you are lucky enough to be the 1 in 3 living under a forward looking authority, we heard how your chance of injury or death by collision with a vehicle on the road has reduced by some 40% since the majority of collisions occur on 30mph roads. It is why our young and old no longer consider it safe to walk to school or the shop even though it may be within easy walking distance and certainly a short bike ride away. Vehicles travelling at 30 travel twice as far to stop as those moving at 20 when 'thinking distance' equals the 'braking distance' ie:

30mph: 24 metres - 6 car lengths

20mph: 12m = 3 cars

and at 20mph a driver's visibility splay is twice that of a driver at 30mph.

We were inspired by Lee Waters, Wales' Dep Minister for Climate Change, whose country recently passed legislation to introduce a default 20mph limit with 30 or more as the exception in built up areas and announced Wales Transport Strategy five year priorities to make communities safer and encourage Active Travel. We heard how North Yorkshire and Cornwall campaigners, both rural regions akin to Dorset, are pushing from bottom upwards by helping town and parish councillors understand the facts and pathway by passing a Motion in support of the 20sPlenty campaign and seeking a 20mph limit from their highway authority to show support and demand for lower traffic speeds.

On 6 Oct, I and several others spoke at County Hall during the latest draft 20mph policy to be debated by Dorset Councillors. Having partially succeeded in persuading Councillors to reject the policy last April in favour of one which enabled (not prevented) communities from getting lower speeds, we were not satisfied with the tweaks made to the policy details and particularly the criteria imposed by Dorset Council following its interpretation of Dept for Transport's now decade old guidelines. The policy was recommended for approval by full Council to be heard shortly but it is never too late to voice your concerns.

If your parish or town council has not yet discussed traffic speed in your patch (which I doubt), then ask in the Public Session of your next Council meeting for a Motion to be passed in support of 20mph and get it submitted to Dorset's Executive Member for Highways (Cllr Ray Bryan), to your ward County Councillor and Dorset Council's Leader Spencer Flower.

Might your local councillors welcome a short informative presentation from me on the subject? ...and don't forget to ask me for your Love20 Wheelie Bin Sticker which at just £1. Bulk buy cost, can bring home one day a week that vehicle drivers passing your door should behave with expectation of human beings using the road too.

We have continued to enjoy our story sacks at the weekend. It was lovely to welcome parents into the classroom to view our learning journals and




for the Year 1's to show parents their workbooks. The children are rightly proud of their work and whenever parents can share in that pride is a joyous time.



Explorers Preschool

Explorers marked Remembrance Day painting and collaging poppies and discussing the importance of peace. They thought of ways to spread peace in our school and came up with some lovely ideas. These included using kind hands and sharing. They also learnt about remembering.



This term we have been busy discovering the treasures of autumn! We began our topic with the story 'Leaf Man' it tells the tale of autumn days, gusty winds and a Leaf Man drifting through the countryside. The children loved listening to the story and then went searching for their own leaf person. They then created their own leaf collages.



We continue working on the children's ability to retell familiar stories; they have really enjoyed getting to know the story of Owl Babies. They are enjoying retelling it in our small world set up.

St Anthony's

In Geography, we are learning all about our place in the world. The children have explored their locality using 'Google Earth' and were able to identify local places that were familiar to them. We continue to enjoy regular welly walks to the paddock and the children are noticing the changes in the seasons. They can explain what is happening to the trees and plants and have learn about animals that will begin their hibernation in coming months. They have loved kicking through leaf piles and collecting Autumn treasures.

Our first class book this term has been 'Stanley's Stick' and the children have enjoyed collecting their own 'fantasticks' and creating their own stories around them.

In Art, we are continuing our work on night time collages creating some explosive fireworks pictures. The children used printing, painting and combining materials to create their pictures.



St Mark's

This half term we have been fossil hunting to inspire our study of Mary Anning, the famous palaeontologist. The children enjoyed looking at fossils from bones, shells, plant life and especially that you can get



fossilised poo!

In maths, we have continued our fabulous work on addition and subtraction calculations so we can confidently solve a mix of problems using number lines, base 10 equipment and our favourite: the column method. Now we are beginning to use our knowledge of number families to check our answers or use estimating when working at speed.

We finished our Native American fable about the origins of a crow's feathers in 'A Crow's Tale' and have just begun a non-chronological report all about the life of a lion. The class have already found out lots of great information, as St Mark's is full of budding David Attenboroughs!

In preparation for Remembrance Day on the 11th, we learned about why we wear poppies and how they come in many different colours to symbolise the different people and animals that sacrificed their lives for our freedom. We made a collage of purples, blacks and whites as well as the original reds inspired by the flowers that grew in Flanders Field.



St Francis'

This half term, the children from St. Francis have started to look at sound in science. We have been exploring what actually makes sounds and how it is the vibrations that cause the sound. The children explored different sounds around the classroom from playing different musical instruments to banging their tables and tapping their water bottles. The children then had to use onomatopoeia to describe the sounds that they heard. Some of the words included boom, bang, bump, zip, clatter, clunk. The children really enjoyed this lesson as they obviously got to make lots of noise! Soon we will be investigating how sound travels and making our own cup telephones to investigate and develop our understanding of sound further. We will also be investigating the pitch and volume of sounds.

St Albans'

Recently, St Alban's Class have been looking at the lives of refugee children and asylum seekers. We are currently working hard to create speeches about the rights of all children which has been inspired by our class novel, 'The Boy at the Back of the Class.' We have also started our new science topic, 'Electricity' where we have been investigating different variables which affect the brightness of a bulb.






