## **PCR Tests**

Currently and as a temporary measure, if you do not have symptoms of COVID-19 and you get a positive lateral flow test result, you will not need to take a follow-up PCR, but you must self-isolate immediately.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, you still need to self-isolate and get a PCR test.

Whilst levels of COVID-19 are high, the vast majority of people with positive LFD results can be confident that they have COVID-19.

This could change at short notice so please check at the Government website www.gov.uk



To use the NHS App you must be aged 13 or over and registered with a GP surgery in England.

You can use the NHS App to:

- get your NHS COVID Pass view and download your COVID Pass for places in England and Wales using this service, or for travel abroad.
- **get advice about coronavirus** get information about coronavirus and find out what to do if you think you have it.
- order repeat prescriptions see your available medicines, request a new repeat prescription and choose a pharmacy for your prescriptions to be sent to.
- appointments search for and cancel appointments at your GP surgery, and see details of your upcoming and past appointments.
- **get health advice** search trusted NHS information and advice on hundreds of conditions and treatments. You can also answer questions to get instant advice or medical help near you.
- view your health record securely access your GP health record, to see information like your allergies and your current and past medicines. If your GP has given you access to your detailed medical record, you can also see information like test results and details of your consultations.
- **register your organ donation decision** choose to donate some or all of your organs and check your registered decision.
- **find out how the NHS uses your data** choose if data from your health records is shared for research and planning.
- · view your NHS number

Taking the Environment Around Marnhull Seriously

On yer bike...?

Marnhull Green Teams are considering installing cycle racks at key points around the village. There's often the temptation to jump in a car to go to the shops or the Rec, say, but that's not good for the environment, and it's not the healthy option either. If you can bike, that's great - but you do need somewhere safe to park your trusty cycle. And without purposebuilt racks the risk is that bikes are secured to railings or benches etc and get in other people's way.

By coincidence a benefactor is liaising with Marnhull Parish Council about providing a set of racks at the Village Hall. This is an obvious location, and the Green Teams fully support this initiative and will learn from it when and if we are able to install racks elsewhere.

The number of racks at each location will vary. Shoppers, for example, are not likely to need to park their bikes for very long, but visitors to the Rec, the Hall, the Legion, the churches or the pubs may stay longer. So, while one rack may suffice at the shops, more would be good at longer-stay locations.

The Green Teams are currently looking at possible sites and will be liaising with leaseholders and landowners as well as the local authorities. So far the idea has been met with enthusiasm, although practical considerations present some difficulties. We will also have to raise the necessary funds, of course.

But now is the time to have your say! Where do *you* think would be good places for bike racks in Marnhull? All suggestions will be welcome. You can contact us at marnhullgreen@outlook.com, on (01258) 268714, or via Facebook.

Get in touch too if you would like one or more bird cherry, hornbeam, sweet chestnut, oak or ash whips and saplings. We are able to offer these at very low prices.

And/or would you like a pdf copy of our revised Recycling Guide for the Marnhull Area? If so, again please use the contact above.

The village recycling centre continues to draw crowds. It's usually open on Saturday mornings 10-12, at the same time as the Hub Repair Café, and can be found at the back of the Village Hall. We can take many materials that the Council can't, supported by the Terracycle network. Reduce, Reuse, Recycle continues to be the motto, so a new trial initiative is a Scrap Table. Crafters, please note!

Finally, please contact us if you would like to know more about the shared community vegetable allotment at Sodom Lane. This is a shared resource, cultivated on a strip basis. You can have as little or (within reason!) as much land as you'd like, and expert advice is available if you're new to 'allotting'. After all, Spring is just around the corner...!







# MARNHULL CHURCHES TOGETHER - LENT LUNCHES AND REFLECTIONS

Lent is the forty-day period beginning on Ash Wednesday (2nd March this year) leading up to Good Friday (15th April) when Christians traditionally take time to reflect on the meaning of Christianity and its relevance in the world today. The three Christian Churches in Marnhull, Saint Gregory's Parish Church, Our Lady's Roman Catholic Church and Marnhull Methodist Church, are delighted to announce a return to our tradition of a series of Lent lunches preceded by a half hour reflection led by each of the churches in turn.

The reflections will be held each Friday during Lent in the Methodist Church beginning at 12 noon and will be followed by a light lunch in the Methodist Church hall beginning at 12:30 (except when there is a village lunch in the village hall). Every one, whether a member of any of the churches or not, is warmly welcome to join us for either or both the reflection and lunch. The theme of the reflections will be Forgiveness and Compassion as demonstrated by Jesus Christ as He approached His crucifixion and the leaders plan to include examples of how artists have incorporated these virtues in paintings.

Assuming that Covid restrictions and recommendations remain as they are at the time of writing, masks will be worn during the reflection in church and when moving around and tables will be placed according to social distancing in the hall for lunch. If necessary, lunches will also be served in the church.

# **BISHOP ANDREW'S MONTHLY LETTER**



Our days are filled with calls upon our time and attention. Among the least welcome are the cold sales calls that intersperse our day - those anonymous, brief exchanges with callers who address us by the name of a long-forgotten tenant of our home, and with whom no kind of even fleeting relationship is possible. Several

times a week, we might rush from the bathtub, meal table or meeting to pick up the phone, only to be asked whether we are the householder - and feel our heart sink and blood pressure begin to rise.

The poor fools who work in call centres have my pity - only because I was one of them for a while. I was selling advertising for a local newspaper. I found making cold calls so impossibly awkward, I even tended to depart from the usual script and began my sales pitch with 'I'm so sorry for bothering you', 'you probably won't want this', and 'you must feel free to say no, but I have to call you...' Just occasionally, this grovelling approach actually worked, and one could have a proper conversation. I lasted but five months on the job.

Then there are other calls: calls which are so surprising, so welcome, that life seems to open up with their appearance. These little epiphanies can come through the phone - in the good news of a job offer or an unexpected invitiation. But, equally, they come in other ways: someone in need, form of a sudden revelation - like a film or piece of music, perhaps, which might fill us with a sense of expectancy, or expresses our yearning so deeply that we are renewed. These kinds of encounters not only inspire us, but they also ask something of us and call us forward into a different way of life.

'Behold', says the risen Christ in the Bible: 'I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice, and opens the door, I will come in, and will eat with him, and he with me.' Scripture invites us to imagine Christ as an unexpected caller: one who will not barge in, but patiently waits for our response. He does not want a minute of our time, or have an unrepeatable special offer, but comes to meet us so that we might follow where he will lead. The Lord's arrival in our midst is the wonder of this season: bearing the light of the world, he calls us forth. As with gladness so many have done before, may we also follow.

# STURMINSTER NEWTON COMMUNITY FRIDGE IN THE EMPORIUM



In December 2020, in the depths of COVID, the North Dorset Community Fridge opened in Sturminster Newton.

It was the first in North Dorset and its opening was inspired by Cllr Millie Earl who had opened four in the Bournemouth/Poole area.

The fridge complements The Pantry, but it is as much about

preventing food waste as it is to help people to stretch their household budget. Food that is passing its Best By date is donated by Tesco's, the food is safe, it just doesn't reach Tesco's quality standards any more. The food is collected from the Blandford and Shaftesbury stores before they close and delivered to The Emporium the following morning. As the food is donated, is it free for anyone to take regardless of financial circumstances. As The Emporium is open Monday to Saturday, the food can be picked up on any day. It is fantastic that local allotment holders and gardeners have added to the range of items that are free to take. Flowers and plants are also collected from time to time.

There are now Community Fridges in Shaftesbury and Blandford, so it is brilliant to see that the idea is spreading. The fridge runs, not only with the support of Tesco's through FareShare GO, but also a team of volunteers who collect the donations from the stores and keep the fridge clean and meeting the appropriate food standards.

As usual, any initiative like this is always looking for volunteers. If you are able to collect donations once a month from Shaftesbury or Blandford Tesco on Sunday afternoon, to drop off at The Emporium on Monday morning, or collect from Shaftesbury Tesco on Thursday evening at about 8:30 to deliver on the Friday Morning, please contact Ros Eveleigh on 821049. It is amazing what is donated and it 'all goes', a sure sign of success!

The children have been enjoying her at school whilst she undertakes her training, she has been out walking and of course has been cuddled.






# **Hedgehog Blog**

# DORSET'S GREEN FIELDS UNDER THREAT FROM DEVELOPERS



Some 56% of Dorset is designated as Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), more than any other county in England. Much of the housing proposed in the draft Dorset Local Plan will be built either in or very close to AONB land, changing forever the county's unique landscape and rich biodiversity.

Research carried out by CPRE, the Countryside Charity, reveals that housing that has been approved by AONBs nationally, since 2017/18, is overwhelmingly large executive homes, with only 16% affordable housing. Dorset Council is one of the main authorities regularly surrendering green fields as opposed to brownfield sites.

Natural England and a number of neighbouring authorities are critical of the Dorset Plan. For example, "Natural England considers there is limited scope for major new development within the Dorset AONB above that already allocated." With reference to development at Blandford Forum, they state that "The scale and location of the development will inevitably result in residual adverse impacts on the Cranborne Chase AONB."

By contrast, numerous developers' submissions propose reducing the current protection of AONBs. Wyatt Homes suggests "these sites should not be excluded simply because the village is within the AONB." Persimmon Grainger admit that part of the proposed Dorchester development would have an impact on the setting of the AONB, but promise to minimize any "specific, evidenced reports" by tree planting. Wates Construction request acceptance of "limited" adverse impacts to land and seascape, rather than none.

Rupert Hardy, Chair of North Dorset CPRE, commented:

Dorset Council admits that the public interest test used to justify the release of AONB for major development is necessary to meet its excess housing target and Cllr David Walsh concedes it is 'likely' that protected areas will be affected by development. This means that town and parish councils who believe themselves protected from development are enjoying a false sense of security.

Town and parish councils who responded to the daft Dorset Local Plan, represent 287,000 voters. Of these, 88% do not agree with the plan, which proposes just over 4,500 homes in or within 250m of an AONB.

Dorset CPRE now calls for Dorset Council to acknowledge the overwhelming public opposition to the Local Plan and to accept that its findings put at risk the special areas of Dorset's countryside. Accordingly, we believe it is now timely to revisit the whole Plan, especially in the light of recent statements by Michael Gove, who clearly signalled a shift towards greater recognition of AONBs as meriting special consideration in future development plans.

## Winter Driving

Driving in the winter has its own challenges with the wet weather, fog, snow and ice that can lead to hazardous driving conditions. Use the tips below to help keep you safe.

You can keep yourself and others safe, by:

- Slowing down and driving to the conditions of the road. Is it wet, icy or muddy?
- Keeping a greater distance between yourself and the vehicle in front, (increase the 2 second rule to 4 seconds or even more)
- · Setting aside extra time to complete your journey
- · Keep your mobile fully charged
- On colder days be particularly careful on tree lined roads the trees
  prevent the sun's warmth from reaching the road, which may still be
  icy when all around has thawed
- Demist and clear frosty/snow covered windscreens. Demist and clear mirrors too!
- Use headlights when foggy and in poor light. Do NOT use fog lights unless it is foggy
- Do not drive through road closures they are there for a reason!

The Highway Code has the following advice when driving in icy conditions. Rule 231 - Drive extremely carefully when the roads are icy. Avoid sudden actions as these could cause loss of control. You should:

- Drive at a slow speed in as high a gear as possible; accelerate and brake very gently
- Drive particularly slowly on bends where loss of control is more likely.
   Brake progressively on the straight before you reach a bend. Having slowed down, steer smoothly round the bend, avoiding sudden actions
- Check your grip on the road surface when there is snow or ice by choosing a safe place to brake gently. If the steering feels unresponsive this may indicate ice and your vehicle losing its grip on the road. When travelling on ice, tyres make virtually no noise.

## **NEWS FROM THE SPRINGHEAD TRUST**

As some of you have not been able to visit Springhead recently, we thought you might be interested in knowing what we have been doing. We were delighted to welcome schools back with over 400 children visiting. Some chose to come for day trips rather than residential visits due to concerns over Covid, but with long days often ending around campfire, children still had the full Springhead experience. Schools tell us that one of the main reasons they choose Springhead is that it helps them achieve curriculum-related learning outcomes, through activities ranging from creative writing to arts and crafts and forest school activities.

Visitors to open gardens and other events, volunteers, and community groups are among those who have been

able to enjoy the gardens. 2021 saw the launch of an exciting new archaeology project, which has involved local people and amateur archaeologists in digging test pits and processing finds including Mesolithic flint blades and iron age pottery.



New members have joined our regular Wednesday 'Garden Gang', which looks after the ornamental gardens, and we have started a new 'Winter Wednesdays' group that is focusing on the North orchard. Fresh produce grown at Springhead has helped to supply a Shaftesbury food charity and

community scheme.

One of our key ojectives is to conserve and enhance our buildings and 15 acres of grounds. Alongside the regular maintenance and improvement works, one of this year's challenges has been



to deal with urgent repairs needed to the mill building, the hub of our activities. With grants from funders, and generous support from the local community, Springhead's tiled roof has now been replaced and associated works carried out to loft windows, gutters and drainage.

The Springhead Trust was set up by a pioneer ecologist, and Springhead has grown and developed as a centre for sustainability. With fewer visitors, there have been more opportunities to address environmental improvements.

- A range of biodiversity surveys have been carried out to find out about the species at Springhead, such as the Privet Hawk-moth, and help us manage the environment appropriately.
- A survey of birds, carried out by a local ornithologist, revealed nearly 70 species which benefit from the varied habitats.
- Our Productive Gardens Co-ordinator has developed sustainable gardening techniques such as gathering weed from the lake and turning it into compost for the gardens.



# UK'S BIGGEST EVER EQUESTRIAN ROAD SAFETY STUDY REVEALS HIGH LEVELS OF RISK AND STRESS



Equestrians and their horses are being subjected to alarming levels of stress and risk according to a new study that was funded by the Department for Transport (DfT) and commissioned by The British Horse Society (BHS).

This is believed to be the biggest ever equestrian safety survey involving over 7,000 participants - with ages ranging from 18 to 97

and with an average of 35 years' enquine experience!

Only 3% of equestrians said they never felt stressed/anxious when using roads while 43% did so more than half the time. By far, the main contributors to this stress/anxiety were considered to be the behaviour of other road users (93%) and the characteristics of the road (62%).

Riding, carriage driving and in-hand activities on roads were considered higher risk in relation to all other activities; including eventing or cross-country jumping which was considered more of a moderate rather than high-risk activity.

The study was conducted by Dr Dee Pollard and involved four elements of research: a review of existing published DfT and BHS data, a survey among 6,000 equestrians from October 2020 looking at how frequently equestrians used roads and off-road routes with their horses and what influenced their ability to do so. Also qualitative work-focus groups and interviews, which in turn informed a second quantitative survey focusing on road safety in the summer of 2021 which generated 7,124 responses. What was encouraging is that 98% of equestrians reported using safety measures such as wearing high visibility clothing when using the roads, though only 22% reported using a camera.

Seriously though, 78% of equestrians said they had experienced an incident while using roads with their horse (the majority experiencing more than 10). These were not officially reported at the time. However, in terms of actions, The BHS has launched the Horse i app which equestrians can use to easily report an incident and to help build up an accurate picture of the dangers faced by riders and their horses on UK roads. If you experience an event, no matter how small, then report it please. It will increase our profile within the village and create a database of incidents in and around our area. You can easily download the app. "Horse i" incident reporting. It is very simple to use. Take care everyone and here's to a good 2022.

Please be reminded that the car park is exclusively for Village Hall and Recreation Ground users and is not intended for overnight or long-term parking. Would the owners of these vehicles please remove them to save us looking at closing the gates?

# **Safer Streets**

This project continues but, your ideas to help walkers, cyclists, disabled in wheelchairs, and horse riders, would be appreciated as we work to minimise the impact of inconsiderate car drivers.

We recently agreed with Dorset Highways department two locations in the village for a Speed Indicator Device to be installed. Hopefully you will start to see work commencing on their installation within the month.

### Planning

We continue to be active in representing the village through commenting on planning applications, of which there have been plenty in recent months, with the expectation of plenty more to come! At our last meeting on the 12th January, we agreed an objection to the Butts Close application detailing 7 material planning considerations.

### **Council Tax Charges**

Marnhull Parish Council is acutely aware of the inflationary pressures being experienced by our parishioners. The press is full of doom and gloom about energy prices, supply chain pressures increasing the costs for food and basic essentials and above inflation increases in council taxes.

An element of the Council Tax you pay to Dorset Council is the Parish precept which is used by Marnhull Parish Council to maintain village amenities and ensure our village retains its unique character. We are pleased to let you know that the Parish Council recently unanimously voted not to increase the precept for the forthcoming year.

For a typical band D property, the precept equates to 80.5p per week. To put that into perspective, about a third of a cup of coffee or a fifth of a pint at the pub. The Parish Council's overriding objective is to use this money wisely and deliver value to you as a council tax payers. So, what do we do with the precept money?

The major items within the budget are:

- We maintain the grounds at St Gregory's, at the Recreation Ground and the Village Cemetery, including where necessary maintaining the trees to ensure these are community resources, we can be proud of
- We provide and maintain playground equipment at our fantastic children's playground.
- · We contract to ensure the litter bins are regularly emptied.
- We maintain the car park near the post office.
- We provide the allotments for villagers to rent at vert attractive rates.
- We work with Dorset Council on projects such as the provision of Speed Indicator Devices to address speeding on our roads which will be funded by the Parish in 2022.
- We make Community Grants to help local organisations undertake projects that are to the village's benefit.
- We contract expert planning advice to help us challenge planning applications that you, our parishioners, feel are not appropriate to maintain the look and feel of our village.

We hope you will agree that this is value for money for 80.5p per week. We would also like to remind you that you are also very welcome to attend Parish Council meetings that take place monthly in the Village Hall to see local democracy in action, but also to raise local issues that concern you or to raise other areas where we might want to utilise our limited funding to improve village life.

We rear and sell Free range pork, along with grass fed Beef and Lamb, in Fontmell Magna. We live in Marnhull and you can also catch us at School & Village events as we are members of

St Greg's PTFA.

After renting and having to move several times, we finally found land to purchase that would allow us to fulfil some of our farming ambitions. Flat pasture surrounded by wild rose and blackberry bushes, an unmistakable Oak tree, and a glorious sunset. We have wasted no time in making it home for our rare breed pigs, our sheep, and cattle. We never know what excitement or drama will unfold from arriving to find our Sow Ginger and her piglets trotting around outside of their pen merrily helping themselves to the apple stash, to being slapped around the face with a large muddy ear belonging to our sow Gloria. We have so many funny stories and just as many disastrous ones, but we are just so grateful to be outside, with animals of such distinct characters, doing something we love.

After an impossibly tough few years, this New Year brings opportunitym hope and excitement for us. The incredibly gruelling dark winter months will soon fade & we will start to see bulbs bursting from the ground & welcome new life to our little farm. Tigger & Coco, our 9 week old kittens are causing havoc already and will hopefully make themselves very useful soon. Our chickens are getting fed up with laying eggs for the naughty rats to enjoy.

An exciting experiment this year will be Rewilding. We will be lending parts of our land to this. We will let you know how it all goes. We will also be erecting a 50ft polytunnel to grow fruit, vegetables and cut flowers for our customers to purchase, something we are very excited about. We are so grateful to our customers for their support and



we hope that along with expanding our customer base and giving people the opportunity to taste our produce, we have many other exciting projects for the year ahead.

Our members have been visited in person and audited by Trading Standards officers to make sure they comply with consumer protection laws and more recently with modern day slavery requirements for the added confidence that vulnerable workers are not being hired to undertake work for you.

We take customer references and make sure complaint procedures are in place if needed. In addition, criminal records checks are undertaken for staff who work in or around your home.

It doesn't stop there! Once a business joins 'Buy with Confidence' they are monitored by Trading Standards through customer feedback, complaint monitoring and every three years are re-visited for another audit.

We would always encourage you to choose a Dorset based trader. However, as the 'Buy with Confidence' scheme is also run by all our neighbouring local authorities, then the pool of Trading Standards approved traders is much greater than just those who are Dorset Council approved.

Other trader approval schemes are available but remember, only 'Buy with Confidence' has this level of Trading Standards approval and access to a nationwide database of complaints made by consumers so we can truly vet them.

Lockdowns, travel restrictions and online learning have reduced social interaction and impacted a very important period in the young people's lives and development. For many of us the opportunity for us to our older children to travel, experience different cultures or to support community projects in the developing world were something we took for granted and were important learning opportunities that simply have not been an option over the last two years.

So we thought what could the Marnhull Hub do to support the younger adults that are the future of our village to gain valuable life experience as the world opens up again during 2022?

## We are very pleased to announce the Marnhull Hub Travel Bursary!

The idea of the Bursary is to provide impactful financial support for one or two young adults aged between 17 and 21 who have lived within the Marnhull Parish boundaries for at least two years to enable them to participate in a volunteering project overseas during 2022. There are several organisations specialising in offering volunteering opportunities covering a wide range of countries and scope, such as supporting community projects (building schools, clean water, literacy, etc), or ecological projects. Proposed volunteering projects will be culturally immersive and provide an opportunity for personal development.

The recipient would be expected to fund a similar amount to the Bursary award from other means (their own funds, fundraising events, or sponsorship) to meet the full costs of the trip. 


