Patient Access

The Blackmore Vale Partnership is now using Klinik as a new way of improving access for patients, which replaces the E-consult service. When the Practice is open, registered patients can submit requests for appointments, medical needs and sick notes, repeated prescriptions, prescription enquiries, nursing appointments, wellbeing support and administration enquires through this system.

From this online enquiry you will get support / services from the right person at the right time, usually the same day. The Klinik system and the clinical triage team together will direct the enquiry to the right team and arrange appropriate appointments. If you do not have access to a computer, the patient care co-ordinator team will support patients through the service by telephone, or via computer screens within the surgery.

Patients and the Practice have already seen considerable improvements in the few months Klinik has been in operation. There has been an increase in response times to patient requests and a reduction in the time that patients experience holding on the telephone. For example, before the introduction of Klinik, on average on a Monday, there were 750 telephone calls, now that has been reduced to 350, as more patients are using the online system. Please use Klinik as your port of call, if you have online access as this frees up the telephone lines, for those that don't.

Over the next few weeks, you may receive a text asking you to take part in a very short survey which will help the Practice to understand how Klinik is working for patients and how it can be improved. We would be most grateful if you could spare two minutes to take part, whether or not you have used Klinik, as we want to understand some of the reasons that people have not used it, as well as their experience of the application. Thank you.

NHS Prescription Prepayment Certificate (PPC)

A PPC could save you money if you pay for your NHS prescriptions. The certificate covers all your NHS prescriptions for a set price and you will save money if you need more than 3 items in 3 months, or 11 items in 12 months.

The prescription charge in England is £9.35 per item. A PPC costs:

- £30.25 for 3 months
- £108.10 for 12 months

Before buying a PPC check online, or by telephone 0300 330 1341, to see if you're entitled to free NHS prescriptions and other help with health costs. You can buy a PPC online or at a registered pharmacy.

- September another electric vehicle event







The November programme was presented by Bridget Brown, a newcomer to the Society. She began with two pieces by Bernstein , the first a rendition of one of his Chichester Psalms, a rousing choral piece not previously played. By complete contrast, this was followed by a West Side Story soundtrack 'Gee Officer Krupke'. A well known march by Mozart followed and then the beautiful voice of Emma Kirby singing Mozart's 'Exultate Jubilate', a joy to listen to. We were then treated to Rutter's interpretation of Shakespear's 'Blow, blow the Winter Wind', very apt on the wet and windy night we were experiencing! Next came a lively jazz piece, Gershwin's 'Lady be Good' performed by Django Reinhardt and Stephane Grapelli. This had all our feet tapping! Ending the first half was Rimsky Korsakov's 'Capricio Espanol', a dramatic Spanish flavoured piece with its change of pace interspersed with castanets and loud brass.

After welcome coffee, the second half commenced with MacCunn's 'The Land of the Mountain and Flood', a slow beginning ending in a swirling crescendo, a lovely piece of many moods. By contrast we were treated to Ella Fitzgerald singing Cole Porter's 'I Get a Kick out of You', a nostalgic piece that everyone enjoyed. Mendelssohn followed with his Scherzo, mainly consisting of strings, cello and bass - reputedly written when he was just sixteen!

For those in the audience who thought no programme is complete without Beethoven, there was a real treat listening to the Rondo from his Piano Concerto No.4 played by Vladimir Ashkenazy. A lively ballet extract from 'Les Biches' by Poulenc followed. Grieg came next, a symphonic dance, a calm lilting melody varying in mood and tempo. The evening concluded with Shostakovich's 'Tahiti Trot; Tea for Two;, and everyone went home happy.

Congratulations to Bridget for a very varied and enjoyable first programme, we look forward to her next!

Standing together in solidarity, they provide an active witness to the Gospel message of love of neighbour.

FROM REVD ANGUS MAYHEW, ST GREGORY'S ST GREGORY'S CHURCH CHURCH

For the first time in my life, I've been asked to teach - at Gillingham school. I'll teach four GCSE lessons on how Christians live out their faith in the community.

It is a precious opportunity to engage with these young people. What would you want to teach them? And what would you tell them about how you live out your faith? Well, I'm really excited to spend time with these people. Young people are always inquisitive and pushing boundaries. Whilst this can be a cause for concern around anti-social behaviour, the reality is these people are serious about their environment and caring for each other. We mustn't forget the age group who bravely try new skateboard tricks and who enjoying partying together on our city streets are the same people who flew Spitfires in the Battle of Britain. We needed their energy then and should treasure it now. However, I think this particular generation of young people are a unique generation from whom we can learn even more. Children and young people today are the first people ever to have access to information without control. They literally have the information of our species and world in the palm of their hand via mobile phones and internet search engines. Gone are the methods of controlling information through education, churches, and those in authority. This generation is liberated from all that control and editing. And because they are inquisitive, I think we should expect some uncomfortable challenges from them about the decisions we have made for ourselves and our community. For me, the most important benefit of listening to our young people is to see what God is doing in their lives. Our faith says that God is with us all. 'And remember, I will be with you always, to the end of the age.' (Matthew 28:20)

Christians accept this continual presence from God and it comes with its own beautiful theology: missio Dei - the mission of God. Put simply this is God's interaction with the world. In Christian mission we are asked to find out where God is working in the world and to join in. This is not a polite platitude, a gentle nose-gay of our faith. It is a radical point of meeting our living God among us and recognising that God is active in our world and deeply interested in it.

Therefore, we are not believers in a dying faith and an absent God. We are journeying with a radical, present God who may ask us difficult questions and challenge our routines and practices. It is our joy to follow him into the unknown with the single-minded delight of his love for us. Christ made clear his views on children: 'whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me'. (Matthew 18:5) I can't wait to learn from them!

We discovered the meaning of wreaths, evergreen and everlasting and made some wreaths of our own.


PANTO.


our rendition of the 12 days of Christmas. Adding to the fun we were delighted to have Jungle Hut join us for our jollies.

HERE ARE A FEW POINTERS ON HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF

- NEVER give out your pin number or bank details to ANYONE who calls you no matter who they claim to be or where they claim to be from
- DON'T give out passwords
- DO NOT enter into a contract over the phone
- DON'T ring the number the caller has given you to check authenticity - look the number up yourself
- DON'T call premium numbers to claim a prize
- NEVER send cash in a taxi or via courier
- NEVER send bank cards anywhere always keep them with you

DO NOT ENGAGE WITH THESE FRAUDSTERS. HANG UP ON FRAUDSTERS!

Winter Driving

Driving in the winter has its own challenges with the wet weather, fog, snow and ice that can lead to hazardous driving conditions. Use the tips below to help keep you safe.

You can keep yourself and others safe, by:

- Slowing down and driving to the conditions of the road. Is it wet, icy or muddy?
- Keeping a greater distance between yourself and the vehicle in front, (increase the 2 second rule to 4 seconds or even more)
- Setting aside extra time to complete your journey
- Keep your mobile fully charged
- On colder days be particularly careful on tree lined roads the trees prevent the sun's warmth from reaching the road, which may still be icy when all around has thawed
- Demist and clear frosty/snow covered windscreens. Demist and clear mirrors too!
- Use headlights when foggy and in poor light. DO NOT use fog lights unless it is foggy
- Do not drive through road closures thet are there for a reason!

The Highway Code has the following advice when driving in icy conditions. **Rule 231** - Drive extremely carefully when the roads are icy. Avoid sudden actions as these could cause loss of control. You should;

- drive at a slow speed in as high a gear as possible; accelerate and brake very gently
- drive particularly slowly on bends where loss of control is more likely. Brake progressively on the straight before you reach a bend. Having slowed down, steer smoothly round the bend, avoiding sudden actions.
- check your grip on the road surface when there is snow or ice by choosing a safe place to brake gently. If the steering feels unresponsive this may indicate ice and your vehicle losing its grip on the road. When travelling on ice, tyres make virtually no noise.

NEW FROM TRADING STANDARDS: BUY SAFE

A survey by the Chartered Trading Standard's Institute found that many people did not understand what to look out for to make sure that the goods they bought online were safe.

Counterfeit perfumes have been found to contain dangerous levels of methanol, which can cause irritation to the skin, eyes and damage the nervous system. Counterfeit toys have been found to contain illegal levels of phthalates, a plastic-softening chemical that can cause cancer, asthma and fertility problems.

Toys and other electrical items which are operated by lithium-ion button or coin-cell batteries are also a particular concern; by law they must have lockable battery compartments, because if a button battery is swallowed by a child it can cause serious internal injuries.

Products such as electronic scooters that use lithium batteries also pose a risk to safety, and there have been several recent cases of these devices catching fire while charging. Poor-quality chargers have also been known to cause electrical shorts, which can lead to house fires.

Consumers are urged to:

- Only shop at reputable retailers, as not only does this increase the likelihood that the product will be safe, but it also means that you will be entitled to a refund if there is a fault.
- Don't always trust online reviews, these can easily be faked.
- Look for the UKCA mark on products such as toys, electrical goods and cosmetics. This ensures that the product has been tested to comply with safety standards.
- Make sure toys and other goods are suitable for children by checking the age range of the item, and never leave a child unattended with a toy that contains small parts.
- Ensure that any item that uses button batteries has a lockable battery compartment.
- Do not buy fakes or counterfeits, it funds criminality, can be poor value for money and is a serious potential safety risk.

If you have seen or have bought something that you think is unsafe, then report it to Trading Standards, by calling the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 0808 2231133.
