Klinik to replace eConsult

This new system, accessible from the Practice website allows you to submit requests for appointments, medical needs, sick notes, repeat prescriptions, prescription enquiries, nursing appointments, wellbeing support and administration enquiries.

The Klinik system and the clinical triage team together, will ensure you will get the support and services from the right person at the right time and if appropriate, will arrange appointments.

If you do not have access to a computer, the patient care co-ordinator team will support patients through the service by telephone, in the normal way, or via computer screens within the surgery.

Other surgeries across Dorset currently using this system, have seen vast improvements in their on the day/routine appointments and a reduction in time that patients experience in waiting on the telephone. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask for more information at the Marnhull, Sturminster Newton or Abbey View, surgeries.

Flu & Covid Vaccinations

If you are eligible, you will be offered a flu vaccination and the Practice aims to offer a COVID Autumn booster in the same appointment. Invitations are being sent to eligible patients in 'waves' to manage booking demand. Please wait to be invited. Telephone lines need to be available for patients requiring medical help so please do not call to chase your invitation. All eligible patients will be invited.

Patients with a mobile number on their records will be sent a text with a link to book an appointment online (your mobile phone will need access to the internet). If the Practice doesn't have your mobile number on file, now is the time to update it, by using the website to do this. If you don't have a mobile number registered, the Practice will telephone to book you in.

BE AWARE: The police have received reports of a scam involving patients being offered flu/covid vaccinations in exchange for a fee/bank details. The NHS will never: Ask you for your bank account/card details; Ask you for your PIN number or banking password; Arrive unannounced at your home to administer your flu/covid vaccine/

Wellbeing

Our health and wellbeing is influenced by many factors, known as determinants of health. These are to do with things like our genetics, environment, work or financial situation, relationships and social factors and medical care. These are all interconnected, but only 20% of our health and wellbeing, is to do with medical care, in other words things that medical interventions can help with. The other 80% is affected by other factors.

So, Wellbeing is taking care of these other things and in particular, your mind as well as your body and this is really important. You may feel worried, or anxious about your life, your health or those close to you. You may feel bored, frustrated or lonely, so it's important to remember that it's OK to feel this way and that everyone reacts differently. Remember, for most of us, these feelings will pass, however the Wellbeing team at the surgery may also be able to help you if needed. 





ART FOR EVERYONE

Art classes at Marnhull and Durweston village halls are back up and running and feeling pretty much (dare i say it!) back to normal. I have my fingers crossed as I type! What have we been up to? Well we have experienced lots of different subjects and experimented with a wide variety of media over the past year and a good amount of work has been created all ready for a fabulous exhibition before too long so watch this space! Autumn last year saw us drawing dried poppy seed heads in water soluble graphite pencil and then painting them with tea, strong English breakfast, delicate Earl Grey, turmeric chai or fruit infusions all of which produced beautiful subtle shades. Blue bell woos in the spring were captured in brilliant bright shades of brusho, powdered pigment which explodes with colour when water is added. We painted the Barn owls at Bere Marsh farm in gouache from amazing photos kindly supplied by local wildlife photographer Alan Wicks. Vintage tractors in watercolour were fun as were quirky giraffe portaits. Our Sunflower collage project in the summer term was very poignant. Using layers of coloured paper and watercolour paint in the colours of the Ukrainian flag we combined newspaper cuttings of the war in Ukraine with bright sunflowers, the national flower and a symbol of hope. Each painting is unique and a record of the difficult and ongoing struggle. This got us thinking and talking. As a

MARNHULL WOMEN'S INSTITUTE

I had heard of Julia's House but it wasn't until I heard Amanda Valentine's excellent presentation that I had any idea of the enormous scope and commitment of this extraordinary organisation. I suspect many others in the audience were similarly astonished.

Julia's House is a hospice for children in Wiltshire and Dorset with life

threatening or life-limiting conditions. Recognising the catastrophic

burden such a situation places on a family, the focus of the staff is to care for every member of the afflicted household and support them in every way possible. Each sick child is allocated 200 hours per year and this time can be used however is most suitable for that child and those who care for him. A morning a week in the noisy, fun-filled play area with its array for magical toys and experiences could give exhausted parents a valuable bit of free time. A nurse and a helper could take the child for a walk in the park or to a beach. One little girl wanted to ride a pony, so that is what she was helped to do. One boy just loved to splash in a bubble-filled jacuzzi. There are things on offer that almost defy the imagination: a trampoline just for wheelchairs, a swing for bedbound little bodies, a room where the patterns on the floor change on demand or music can be conjured with a wave of the hand. Other children in a family with a very sick child often find themselves sidelined as the needs of their sibling trumps their own. Julia's House staff arrange outings and holidays for these youngsters, taking them camping or on other adventures where they make friends with other children who understand what they are enduring.

Once a child and his family have come under the care of Julia's House they remain so until the child id eighteen when he is progressed on to other organisations. If, as sadly often happens, the child dies, enveloping support is given to all the family and the final days can be spent in a dedicated suite with the love and full time attention of familiar nurses and helpers. Afterwards the bereaved family remains part of the bigger family of Julia's House and bereavement counselling is offered.

Julia's House is 90% funded by public donations. Fundraising is constant and relentless and much of the money to run this fantastic organisation comes from legacies in wills.

In October our talk is entitled "Hedgehogs in need."

NEWS FROM TRADING STANARDS: BUTTON BATTERY SAFETY

Button batteries are used to power everyday items including car key fobs, remotes, and children's toys, but if swallowed, they could badly injure or kill a child.

Button batteries react with saliva to create caustic soda, which is the chemical often used to unblock drains. If a child swallows a button battery and it gets stuck in their food pipe (oesophagus), it can burn a hole and cause internal bleeding, or even death. If a button battery gets into the stomach, it can also cause significant tissue damage.

Larger lithium 'coin cell' batteries (about the size of a five pence piece) are the most dangerous. Smaller batteries can be inserted into places such as ears and noses, causing serious injuries for children if undetected.

- Store spare batteries securely and out of children's reach. Be careful when opening multi-packs of button batteries to ensure they do not fall on the floor.
- Know what products use button batteries and check that the
 button battery compartment is secure. Put products with unsecured
 button batteries out of children's reach. Under product safety
 regulations, button battery compartments in toys require to be
 secured.
- **Educate older children about button batteries** including why they should not play with them or give them to younger children.
- Discard dead button batteries straightaway as even dead button batteries can still have enough power to badly hurt a small child. When you remove a button battery, store it securely, and recycle it properly and promptly.
- Act promptly if you suspect a child has swallowed a button battery, take them straight to the nearest A&E department or call 999 for an amublance. take the battery packaging, toy, or gadget if you can, to help staff identify the battery. Symptoms may not be obvious. Your child might be coughing, gagging, or drooling, or pointing to their throat or tummy. Unclear or fluctuating symptoms mean it is important to be vigilant. Do not let your child eat or drink and do not make them be sick.

MARNHULL WAR GRAVE

A few months ago Revd Gaenor Hockey was informed by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) that there is a war grave in St Gregory's Churchyard; could they put a small notice at the entrance to the churchyard informing visitors of this fact.

Searching the CWGC records I found that, indeed, Aircraftman William John Lloyd is buried here. We have a record of all the graves in St Gregory's churchyard. Searching this revealed that at grave P33 (Northern graveyard extension) there is a Service Headstone, "909807 Aircraftman W.J.Lloyd, Royal Air Force, [died] 3rd September 1940, age 24".

His name also appears on the War Memorial at the Eastern end of New Street. If you are interested in seeing this grave, enter the churchyard at the Church Hill entrance. Follow the mown path (approximately parallel to New St).

About three quarters way along this path, look to your right and, between your path and the North boundary, you will see the upright service gravestone, with the RAF crest at the top. In the immediate vicinity you can see other Lloyd family graves. Of particular interest to some, there is the grave of William's father, who lived at "Woodlands Farm, Ham Lane" - presumably where Woodlands Close now stands.

Ecumenical talk at St Andrews Church, Todber

Do you know that feeling? You know; the one where you are flowing along, content, empty mind, calm, relaxed body, smooth brow? Free from thoughts, no

It happens by accident sometimes. Maybe you don't feel you deserve that. If you're not sure what

expectations, no time - just gradual renewal.

this feeling is, watch extreme sports on Youtube. On the surface you will see adrenalin and the baffling bravery of youth; but you will also see a calmness and self-connection. They silently express themselves.

This state is sometimes called 'flow-state'. For me, to reside in this state for any time is precious prayer and connection to our creator God. Often there are no words needed in prayer. In the moment I feel there is a shared delight with our creator in the experience of flow which is timeless and beyond words. I think he needs this as much as we do. After all, we are told that God looks on us as a mother nursing her child. So, it seems reasonable to assume God must adore watching us at peace in our environment and with ourselves. After all, how can we love our neighbours as ourselves, if we don't take time to love ourselves?

Robert Pirsig's 1974 best selling book: Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance had a problem trying to set out what Zen is because, as the philosopher explained, Zen is nothingness and as soon as you try to capture and summarise it, it makes no sense. Pirsig's quest for meaning is played out over a motorcycle road trip, which is where I find the tranquility of flow. Before my ordination and starting my role as your curate to St Gregory's church, my wife and I took a motorcycle trip of our own. We spent many hours lost in delight rural France. We had an old road atlas and no sat nav and so consequently were unable to plan a route so just rode along fabulous roads searching for lunch. On the Sunday we came across a motorcycle blessing at a French monastery. About 150 bikers turned up on all sorts of bikes in leathers, tattoos, and grins. We all filled respectfully into a mass and afterwards rode the private drive to queue for our individual blessings. It was perfect. Over the coming years of my

curacy to train with Revd Gaenor, I hope to meet you and to see where you meet God or to sit and chat about our God who came so that we would have life and have it in all its abundance.
