

STURMINSTER NEWTON MEDICAL CENTRE



Supplies of flu vaccines are due to arrive at the end of September. Every year the Joint Committee for Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) recommend the type of vaccine to be offered to individuals and which age and at risk groups should receive it.

This year, the JCVI have recommended the following groups receive the vaccine:

- Anybody aged 65 years and over (including those becoming 65 years by 31st March 2023)
- At risk patients aged 2-65 years

- Chronic (long term) respiratory disease, such as asthma (requires continuous or repeated use of inhaled or systemic steroids or with previous exacerbations requiring hospital admission), chronic obstructive oulmonary disease (COPD) or bronchitis

- Chronic heart disease, such as heart failure
- Chronic kidney disease at stage 3, 4 or 5
- Chronic liver disease
- Chronic neurological disease, such as Parkinson's disease or motor neurone disease
 - learning disability
 - diabetes
 - splenic dysfunction or asplenia
- a weakened immune system due to disease (such as HIV/ AIDS) or treatement (such as cancer treatment)

- morbidly obese (defined as BMI of 40 and above)

- Pregnant women (including those who become pregnant during the flu season)
- Household contacts of immunocompromised individuals where sharing accommodation and close contact is unavoidable
- Those in receipt of carer's allowance, or who are the main carer of an older or disabled person
- Children aged 2 or 3 years on 31 Aug 2022
- Secondary school-aged children focusing on Years 7, 8 and 9 and any remaining vaccine will be offered to years 10 and 11, subject to vaccine availability and provided through the school age immunisation service
- Healthy adults 50-64 years and those who turn 50 from 31st March 2023 from 15th October 2022
- Front line healthcare and social care workers (to be offered by employees)

Eligible patients will be contacted when appointments are available.

Covid vaccinations - Autumn programme

JCVI advice as at 15/7/22 confirms that the COVID-19 Autumn booster should be offered to tthe following groups:

- Residents in a care home for older adults and staff working in care homes for older adults
- Frontline health and social care workers
- All adults aged 50 years and over
- Persons aged 5 to 49 years in clinical risk group, as set out in the Green Book (https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-the-green-book-chapter-14a)
- Persons aged 5 to 49 years who are household contacts of people with immunosuppression
- Persons aged 16 to 49 years who are carers, as set out in the Green Book (https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-the-green-book-chapter-14a)

The Practice is working with NHS Dorset to agree the programme and intend to offer Covid vaccines to those over the age of 18 years. The plan is to run a combined Flu and Covid vaccine programme using The Exchange at Sturminster Newton. Most clinics will be run on a Saturday and it is expected that clinics will have approximately 2500 patients vaccinated in a day. These clinics will be based on an appointment only basis and times will be given to patients to aid through flow and reduce waiting times. The Practice is unable to start these clinics until October as they are dependent on the delivery dates and of the vaccines. Although the vaccines were ordered in January 2022 the delivery schedule is out of the Practice's control. Eligible patients will be contacted when appointments are available. Smaller clinics may be offered later in the Autumn at different sites, depending on uptake.

Klinik Health Solution



From the middle of September the Practice will be implementing a new clinical triage system call Klinik. Patients will be able to access this system via the Practice website. It can be accessed on your phone, or at home on your laptop or PC, it is very simple to use and is user friendly. The system is designed to help get your request / issue to the right person to be able to deal with it effectively and in a timely manner. The system also helps to determine the urgency of the patients needs. It will

NEWS FROM DORSET TRADING STANDARDS

Romance scams are crimes that breaks the hearts of victims, not only because of the financial loss they suffer, but also because of the loss of the relationships they believed were genuine. Thousands of people lose money to romance frauds each year after being conned on internet dating sites and social networks.

Scammers set up fake profiles, fake photos and claim to be from other parts of the world, for example the United States. The scammer weaves a story of a successful person working overseas, and presents themselves as a thoughtful, caring and loving individual who is looking for their soul mate. The scammers are good at what they do: they ask lots of questions of the victim about what they want in their lives. They then use the information and turn it into a dream that becomes a reality to the victim. They use words we all like to hear to win their victim's heart, and they use psychology to hold them in their spell. Once they have established a relationship then the scamming begins. In all cases the plea for financial assistance is the key to the scam. This can be for assistance in cashing a cheque that they are unable to cash themselves, or asking for financial assistance to help them out of a difficulty they are having. For example, they were mugged, or involved in an accident, and are in hospital but cannot pay their hospital bill, or they are desperate to come to visit but need help with the money to manage that.

Signs your friend or family member may be involved in a romance scam:

- They may be very secretive about their relationship or provide excuses for why their online partner has not video called or met them in person. They might become hostile or angry, and withdraw from conversation when you ask any questions about their partner.
- They may express very strong emotions and commitment to someone they have only just met
- They have sent, or are planning to send, money to someone they have not met face-to-face. They may take out loans or withdraw from their pension to send money.



With her clothes on fire she fled screaming through the burning temple. A gunshot at close range hurled her to the ground, blood leaking from the wound in her chest. Her dead body was found in six feet of water, entagled with an anchor chain. And that was all in a day's work for stunt artist Denise Ryan Edwards.

In her fascinating talk, Denise gave some valuable hints in case any of us aspired to a similar careere in films or TV. The first essential is to get one's name into the Stunt Register, the go-to source for directors who need someone to double for their stars in any sort of risky scenario. To do that we will have to state height, weight, colouring, body-shape and so on to make a believable match for the actor in question. Then we will have to prove our skills in at least five disciplines: riding, fencing, swimming, diving, tumbling, acrobatics and so on. If James Bond is to crash his motorbike off the roof of the Albert Hall, the director needs a double who can manage all the necessary parts of the action.

Denise started her career doing synchronised swimming displays and hoped that she would be chosen for acquatic stunts but soon found herself learning to fall from heights, crash cars, ride runaway horses and much more. Over the years she has worked with many of the big names on prime-time TV shows and feature films: The Two Ronnies, Eastenders, Superman, Pirates of the Caribbean, Tomorrow's World to name just a few. She has had a few bruises, she admitted but no serious injury which seems almost miraculous. Denise had so many absorbing tales to tell that we could have kept her talking for hours about her most unusual but satisfying life's work. I watched an old recording of "Last of the Summer Wine" recently and saw the three ancient chums riding their bikes too fast, hitting a stone wall and somersaulting through the air. The camera picked them up lying in a dishevelled heap in a field. And i began to analyse the scene with new eyes.



End of Summer Term! What a busy term we've had, and to end it with such amazing weather! Not only have we had Sports Day, but we've also had Sports Week where coaches from Premier Sports have been coaching the children in athletics, tri-golf, rounders,

whole school, we have been so excited to have been working on our whole school summer production of 'We're all going on a Summer Holiday'. The children have worked endlessly to learn their lines, whole school songs and prepare props. This will be a wonderful way to end our Summer Term and we are thrilled to be welcoming

St Mary's Explorers (Pre-school) - The children have been enjoying books with a minibeast theme. Their favourite's being 'Snail Trail' and 'Super Worm', these books have led their learning around minibeasts. They became fascinated with snails and really enjoyed recreating their spiral patterns and observing snails' movements in their



snail races. The home corner has continued to be a popular area in preschool. Children playing in this area enjoy taking on familiar roles and being imaginative with their friends. They develop many skills playing cooperatively; taking turns, exchanging ideas and working together to solve problems. Whilst playing in this area the adults interact with the children enabling them to widen their vocabulary.

It was so lovely to see our pre-schoolers participating in the school sports day. They excelled and impressed the parents with their confidence and can do attitude, we were all very proud of them. St Mary's Explorers is open from 8:45am - 3:15pm every weekday during term time and spaces are available for children aged 3+ with wraparound care from 8am - 6pm on request. The unit allows Preschool and Reception children to work together on lots of key areas of learning, something that OfSTED agree allows younger children to make greater progress. St Anthony's - The children have really enjoyed our minibeast theme this term. Focusing on the variety of insects, arachnids and gastropods native to the UK. They have taken on the role of minibeast hunters identifying where the bugs could be found and learning that these are called habitats. This has included trips to our paddock to enjoy some



pond dipping. One of our favourite studies has been of the bee. The children loved learning about and having a go at the waggle dance, a communication technique used by bees to communicate where the best flowers are. Once again they wowed us with their artwork using a mix of pastel and pencils.

St Mark's - Our summer term has been jam packed with lots of outside learning, planting and investigations! We have been superscientists this term, learning all about what plants and flowers need in order to survive. We started the term by setting up some fair tests to find out how light, warmth and water can affect the growth of a bean plant. We then observed our findings over the course of 3 weeks and were surprised by our findings. The children found out that plants exposed to sunlight and have enough water grow the best, they made predictions, observations and evaluated their findings at the end of the investigation. A fantastic summer planting experiment. Well done St Mark's!

St Alban's - St Alban's class recently enjoyed a day out at Weymouth Outdoor Education centre. The children completed a variety of activities such as; sailing, archery and tunnelling which tested their leadership,

teamwork and courage. As always, it was a real pleasure and several members of Weymouth Outdoor Education Centre staff commented on how well-behaved the children were. Now it's time to get ready for summer show!
