


..... and so the evening continued.

A New Book On Marnhull



Previous books on Marnhull are now out of print and so to meet a local demand especially from newcomers to the village for information about Marnhull a new handbook has been produced to meet this demand in the form of a gazetteer called "Where's That To In Marn'll Then". It encapsulates a short introductory history of the village to help explain some of the more obscure names as well as listing in a conveniently sized booklet the names of all the houses, places, fields, roads and streets in the village as well as an explanation of each name. It is

designed to answer questions on village names that crop up in everyday local conversations. The names have been drawn from everyday use, from past Censuses, Parish registers, sources in Dorset Archives and previous Marnhull books. This is a helpful A5 size handbook of 250 pages including colour photographs and sketches bringing together both the past and the present in Marnhull.

Marnhull Café Sci May Meeting - what tiny looks like.

We had a good crowd to hear from Malcolm Locke about how things have changed in electronics in the last 40 years.

It makes me feel quite ancient to think that I wrote my first computer program more than 40 years ago. At that time the huge main frame computer was housed in the Computer Room hidden behind doors and tended by a team of computer operators. I would type my program on to punch cards, put them into a pigeon hole outside the Computer Room and a day later a pile of that green lined print out paper would appear in that pigeon hole showing whether or not my program had worked as

Our talk started the story of computers a little later, with the arrival of the first Apple Mac and compared its spec to that of the latest iPhone. The increase in complexity and number of components between the two was

Malcolm helped us to grasp the change by giving us various components to handle at so we could see how they had reduced in size, the smallest being as small as specks of dust. A lot of questions were asked and everyone went away in awe of what has been achieved and thoughts of what might lie in the future.

The next meeting is on 4th June when Nick Lalor will talk about Reducing Vehicle Noise. In the last meeting of this session we will be hearing from David Terrey who will talk about the aquaculture of sea urchins after a short briefing from Morgan Osman on his upcoming trip to the Himalayas where he will be part of a research team studying biodiversity and glacial retreat.



Marnhull Women's Institute

The May meeting was devoted to a discussion of the Resolutions that the WI nationwide will support in the coming year.

The first concerned the worrying decline in the number of young women who are failing to attend for routine cervical screening. Cervical screening can identify pathological changes at an early stage and to prevent 70% of deaths from cervical cancer. Unfortunately the attendance rate for this test is at its lowest since the programme began, especially in the younger age group. There are thought to be a number of reasons for this decline: there is the natural embarrassment felt about this intimate procedure, and also a fear that it might be painful. Thirdly, girls at school now receive the HPB vaccine and they may, erroneously, believe that this protects them from cervical cancer. Alas it does not offer complete protection.

Although there have been some national awareness campaigns on this topic, the WI feels that we are in a position to encourage other women, especially younger ones, to take up this life-saving invitation and attend the screening clinics regularly.

The second Resolution concerned the decline in bus services, especially in rural areas, and to call upon Government to increase the subsidies to allow the services to regenerate. Councils have reduced their spending on bus services by 42% in the last decade and the resulting isolation is felt by people living in the countryside, half of whom now have no bus at all. If villages are to remain viable, and people are to be able to get to school and work and to access other institutions such as hospitals and clinics, a reliable bus service is essential.

After the serious matter of the evening was concluded we braced ourselves for a Beetle Drive. If you have never participated in such an event you should know that Beetle is very simple in concept but very lively in execution. It gives rise to a good deal of frustrated groaning and triumphal whooping, and a lot of rattling. Try it sometime when your nerves are steady.

Next month our speaker is Esme Donohoo with a talk entitled "Daisy Deldridge Florist."

The Organ Restoration Project

The project to restore Salisbury Cathedral's magnificent Father Willis organ is well underway.

The work, which began in January, will take 14 months.

It was 50 years ago that the organ last underwent such a comprehensive restoration.

Some of the pipes will be cleaned on site, with the remainder taken away for cleaning. The mechanics, bellows and reservoir will be repaired.

The work is being carried out by Harrison and Harrison, renowned organ builders and restorers from Durham who have cared for the Cathedral's organ since 1978.

The team is led by Ian Bruce, who has 30 years' experience working with pipe organs.

"Salisbury Cathedral's Father Willis is one of our flagship organs," he said.

"We work on a lot of his organs, but this one is really top of the tree musically and very well respected, due to the high-quality workmanship and the way it is all put together."

Salisbury's Father Willis organ was built in 1877 at a cost of £3,500, a sum given by Miss Chafyn Grove of Zeals.

It has just under 4,000 pipes, ranging in size from ones as small as a matchstick to others that stand 32ft high.

The project will cost about £700,000. The Friends of Salisbury Cathedral has given a substantial grant towards the restoration project and the Cathedral received a grant of £82,300 from the Heritage Lottery Fund for the restoration and the organ exhibition, pulling out the Stops, which is in the north transept and runs until November.







Marnhull Bridge Club meets in the Methodist Hall every Tuesday at 2 pm to play Chicago. New Players always welcome.


Marnhull Tennis Club
